This decade from 1880 to 1891 was to be the most pivotal of his career. The melding of his talents and business sense and the continual hunger of sources for his works made him wealthy. On January 2nd, 1892, Maupassant tried to commit suicide by cutting his throat. Unsuccessful he was committed to the private asylum of Esprit Blanche at Passy, in Paris.
