Their oral testimony and that of other leaders in Indigenous/Navajo education frame and texture the account. Informed by critical theories of education, this book is not just the story of a single school and community. It is also an inquiry into the larger struggle for self-determination by Indigenous and other minoritized communities, raising issues of identity, voice, and community empowerment. *A Place To Be Navajo* asks whether school can be a place where children learn, question, and grow in an environment that values and builds upon who they are. The author argues that the questions *Rough Rock* raises, and the responses they summon, implicate us all.

However, the results also indicate that firms benefit unequally within the cluster environment depending on the specific firm-level, cluster-level, industry-/market-level conditions and their interactions. Based on the previous results and the rich literature about potential failures in innovation systems, a targeted (problem-oriented) policy framework is developed in the third thematic module. By offering a clear categorization of six multidimensional problems within clusters and of the corresponding targeted policy measures, this framework contributes to a more active policy approach that considers the heterogeneity within clusters.

The significance of Heidegger as a thinker of place, Malpas claims, lies not only in Heidegger's own investigations but also in the way that spatial and topographic thinking has flowed from Heidegger's work into that of other key thinkers of the past 60 years.
